As the Programs & Education Lead, you will provide support to the Chapter, including:

- Work closely with staff partner and Chapter Executive to identify and plan the delivery of programs and education within the local community
- Work closely with Community Outreach Lead to identify external opportunities to share Crohn's disease and ulcerative colitis resources and education (i.e. lunch & learns, webinars, etc)
- Assist with the dissemination of Crohn's and Colitis Canada materials, resources and program
 information, including local GI offices, Infusion Centres and other health-care professionals to
 promote, recruit and implement national programs (Gutsy Peer Support, Scholarship, etc)
- Lead the planning and delivery of education presentations at Chapter meetings, including guest speakers, use of available resources and identification of in-demand topics to staff partner
- Where applicable, support the promotion and delivery of Education Symposia events locally

Time Commitment:

- 1-3 hours per week for ongoing support and liaison with staff partner, Chapter volunteers
- Evening and weekend activity is required to attend Chapter meetings and capture high traffic times. Some daytime availability is ideal for liaison with staff partner (phone calls, emails)
- This role requires a commitment of a minimum of 1 year

What you bring:

- Experience with event logistics and planning and education. Strong ties within the local community are an asset. Background in Health Care, Teaching, Event Planning or related profession is ideal. Awareness of the Crohn's and colitis community and their needs is an asset.
- Strong communication skills, both verbal and written and managing various relationships (speakers, venues, etc)
- Excellent attention to detail, well organized and responsive to timely needs and opportunities
- Ideally, experience in a Chapter volunteer role
