- Participate in local, regional and national recognition opportunities (i.e. National Volunteer Week, International Volunteer Day) to communicate the impact of local volunteers
- Share local volunteer successes, stories and gaps with staff partner
- Participate as available on task forces and working groups on national volunteer engagement projects and initiatives

Time Commitment:

- 1-3 hours per week for ongoing support and liaison with Chapter President and other volunteers
- Evening and weekend activity is required to attend Chapter meetings and capture high traffic times. Some daytime availability is ideal for liaison with staff partner (phone calls, emails)
- This role requires a commitment of a minimum of 1 year

- Experience with recruitment, screening, placement, and background in HR/Volunteer Engagement is ideal. Strong ties within the local community are an asset.
- Strong communication skills, both verbal and written and experience with public speaking
- Excellent attention to detail, well organized and responsive to timely needs and opportunities
- Ideally, experience in a Chapter volunteer role
